A group of hunters from Minnesota have been coming to the Crosby, ND area for over 20 years. To give back to the community, they began a benefit for the Divide County Area Dollars



for Scholars. On October 16, 2008, the group held their 4th annual dinner and auction benefit where they provide and serve the dinner, as well as provide items for raffles and auction. This year's raffle item was an autographed football by Adrian Peterson of the Minnesota Vikings. Chapter Board Members assist with the event and do all the promotion. This year's event brought in over \$9,000, with the total for the four years being \$24,700. All money raised at these events is awarded to students from the area.

Fundraising Tips

The following fundraising tips were shared at this summer's workshops. For more information about these fundraisers contact Lori Sayler.

- **Read-a-thon:** Barnes County chapter has students find sponsors to pledge for each book read over a two-week period. Monies stay with each class.
- **Direct Letter Campaign:** Develop a database of local businesses and send out a letter and pledge form annually. Submitted by Bismarck chapter.
- Valentine's Dinner and Dance: An annual themed event. Washburn chapter charges \$30.00 per plate and usually serves 300 people. Students serve as waiters.
- Button Maker: Milnor chapter sells buttons for \$4.00 each, turning a \$2 profit on each. Button machine was purchased at School Specialty Company and students take pictures of each member of the varsity teams in the fall.
- Steak Fry: The Drake chapter charges \$12 for 8 oz. steak and \$16 for a 16 oz. steak. The local bank donates the meat and board members donate desserts. This event usually makes enough to fund two \$500 scholarships.
- Pancake and Sausage Breakfast: Belfield chapter annually holds one as a free-will offering
- Payroll Deduction at local high school: teachers and staff use payroll deduct to fund one \$500 scholarship for a student pursuing a career in teaching

During his visit, Dr. Fradkin had a full schedule. He, along with Curt Trygstad, vice president of Scholarship America: Chuck Stroup, NDDFS President; and Lori Sayler, State Director, met with Chancellor Bill Goetz and Peggy Wipf, Director of Financial Aid for the North Dakota University System (NDUS). Most of the schools within NDUS are Collegiate Partners which allows students to fill unmet need or reduce student loan debt through Dollars for Scholars scholarship money. Discussion during this meeting included having all of the state's postsecondary institutions become Matching Collegiate Partners. In a Matching Partner arrangement, the postsecondary institutions match a Dollars for Scholars scholarship that North Dakota student recipients bring to the educational institution. Fradkin visited Attorney General Wayne Stenehjem and Eric Hardmeyer, BND president, to thank both the Industrial Commission and Bank of North Dakota for the partnership with NDDFS.

Dr. Fradkin appeared on the Bismarck CBS affiliate's Noon Show where he thanked all the state's chapter volunteers for their dedication to North Dakota students. He and Hardmeyer also were guests on the "Joel Heitkamp Show" on the Clear Channel radio network. They discussed BND's partnership with NDDFS and Dr. Fradkin talked about the American Dream.

"Our young people are this country's greatest asset," he said. "If you give them the golden opportunity of education, as well as support, financial assistance, and a dream, there is no limit to what they can achieve."

College Prep Software for All North Dakota Schools BND Renews Sponsorship

Bank of North Dakota (BND) and Student Loans of North Dakota (SLND) have signed a three-year contract with Xap Corporation and Bridges Transitions, a provider of career and educational planning solutions. Through this agreement, every North Dakota middle school and high school will be provided access to Bridges Guidance Central, a software program with career exploration, education planning and test preparation tools. Tools sponsored by BND and SLND include testGEAR for ACT. Choices Planner and Choices Explorer. Students and their parents can access information online from anywhere.

BND and SLND first began sponsoring Bridges Guidance Central products in 2005. For the last three years schools have received access to Choices Planner and testGEAR for ACT; which are geared toward high school students. Choices Explorer, a product designed for middle school students, will also now be available.

In addition to state-wide product distribution, this sponsorship agreement also includes training for North Dakota's education professionals who work directly with students.
