

Helen Kittredge Memorial Endowment



Helen Kittredge, daughter of Herbert and Marion Kittredge, placed great value on education throughout her lifetime. After graduating from Westfield High School in 1910, she completed four years at Wellesley College, earning her B.A. in 1914. She then attended the National German-American Teachers Seminar the following year, after which she began her teaching career as a teacher of German at the Albany Academy for Girls in 1916. Ten years later she attended the Mt. Holyoke German School, and after completing a one-year program, was hired by the Westfield Public Schools as the Head of the Modern Languages Department and a teacher of German. She devoted herself to the young people of Westfield for thirty-two years, earning the respect of both her colleagues and her students for her

dedication and hard work.

Helen's brother Russell made a bequest in his will to create a scholarship in her name as a tribute to her lifetime contribution to education.
