In Loving Memory of Don C. Gackle April 12, 1929 – July 1, 2012

Don was among the first board members who helped establish NDDFS in 2000. He was passionate about youth and education. He believed North Dakota businesses and individuals could unite to do more for motivating ND students to continue their education and NDDFS provided the vehicle to do nddfs.org

that. Don was the first person that stepped forward from the board to take the director on donor calls and he guided the board in its fund raising efforts. He was also passionate about writing and he often used his column to share information about the growth and success of NDDFS. Don was always interested in the progress of NDDFS and about two months before he passed he called for an update and to learn about the awards provided in 2012. Don cared about NDDFS and we value his many contributions to the organization.

Don was an ardent supporter of Garrison Dollars for Scholars. He contributed with donations, but more importantly he was an enthusiastic promoter of our cause. He helped make the chapter welcome at the Missouri Hills Scholarship Banquet which was a great place to distribute scholarships. For many years the Masonic Temple of Garrison had held a banquet where they awarded their scholarships and honored the tops students of area schools. When that group disbanded, Don and Jill Gackle made sure that the banquet continued, and so more scholarships were awarded and more students

were honored through that special event. Don was always looking for ways that DFS could improve and expand, and he was willing to work to make that happen.

Don was born April 12, 1929, in Kulm, ND to Otto and Alice (Higdem) Gackle. He graduated from the University of North Dakota and served two years with the U.S. Army during the Korean War where he was stationed in New Mexico in counter-intelligence during what he jokingly referred to as "The Battle of New Mexico."

After military service, he worked for the Greater North Dakota Association, the state Chamber of Commerce, as the public relations manager for nearly 10 years before purchasing the Farmers Independent in 1963. The Garrison newspaper was soon renamed the McLean County Independent. BHG Inc. was formed in 1972 using the first letter of the names of the three community newspapers that were the beginning of the corporation serving Beulah, Hazen and Garrison. Gackle was inducted into the North Dakota Newspaper Hall of Fame in 2000.

Don entered semi-retirement a few years ago, but retained the title of chairman of the board and continued his column, "Here and There," and wrote an occasional story.
