

Sarah Anderson, recipient of the \$6,000 Bill and Jean Guy Leadership Scholarship

The Bill and Jean Guy Leadership Scholarship focuses on developing future leaders in North Dakota. Demonstration of strong leadership skills and a commitment to giving back in North Dakota are included in the selection criteria.

Sarah Anderson

Motivated by the sense of helplessness she felt when her aunt, cousin and grandmother battled cancer; Sarah Anderson has set her higher-education goals so others may have a better experience. This future doctor of pharmacy will use her training to specialize in infectious disease or oncology.

Sarah graduated from Century High School in Bismarck in 2010 and attends North Dakota State University. She honed her leadership skills in the Girl Scouts receiving the Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards. One of her Girl Scout projects included organizing and leading a Girl Power group for fourth, fifth and sixth grade girls at a low-socioeconomic school. The girls met weekly and learned about healthy relationships, basic health issues and problem-solving skills.

Last spring, she put those leadership skills to work when she was elected executive vice president of the National Society of Collegiate Scholars. When the president resigned, she was elected to that position and helped move the organization forward in a meaningful way. Through the organization, Sarah mentored two middle school students who spoke English as their second language.

When asked what it means to receive this prestigious scholarship, Sarah said, "Governor Guy will always be remembered as a great leader in our community and state. It is an honor to receive a scholarship in his name. To show my appreciation for this award, it is my hope to continue to lead through various organizations, volunteer programs, and my role as a future pharmacist in the healthcare community."

Sarah identifies her strong work ethic as a personal strength, along with her organizational and detail-oriented skills. She has been on the Dean's List every semester since entering college and is a member of the 2013 Golden Key International Honor Society, Phi Eta Sigma National Honor Society, Gold Star Marching Band and Campus Crusade for Christ.

With so many inspirational stories, it's difficult to choose who to highlight in this issue. However, Michael Kaip's story is especially moving. Michael received a \$1,000 Returning Student Scholarship sponsored by Bell State Bank.

Michael plans to become a teacher and coach to inspire children by imparting life lessons through education and sports. This goal is shared by many people with a passion for learning and a love of sports. What makes Michael's story different is he has cerebral palsy. Instead of using his disability as an excuse, he uses it as a motivator. He wants children, with and without disabilities, to have the opportunity to grow in the classroom and athletics. Using sports as an outlet, Michael hopes to help children build confidence by teaching them teamwork, sportsmanship and leadership. Michael was given the opportunity to chase his dreams and he feels others should be able to do the same.

The \$1,000 Returning Student Scholarship is available to students continuing their education beyond the freshman year of college.

"My vision is for kids with disabilities to have the benefits of playing sports and being part of a team," said Michael. "I have always loved sports, but due to my disability, I wasn't able to play."

As a sophomore in high school, Michael learned of a program 200 miles away from his hometown. Hope, Inc., in Fargo, North Dakota, organized sports for kids with mobility challenges. Michael was the student manager for Mandan High School's hockey team and the team was scheduled to play in Fargo. With the help of Hope, Inc., a game of sled hockey was organized for the same day Michael would be in town with the hockey team. Michael planned to play sled hockey and meet the team later. However, the team had other ideas.

"Skating on the ice in a hockey sled was an amazing feeling of freedom," said Michael. "After playing for the first session, I skated to the side of the rink and noticed the Mandan High School hockey team standing at the glass watching and cheering. It was a great feeling to have my team show up to support me.


"During the second session, the coach for Hope, Inc. got the Mandan players in sleds to play with me. Being a playing member of this team was a feeling I had never had before and one I did not want to end. At that moment, I knew we needed to start a program in the Mandan area that gave all kids this opportunity."

Fueled by his experience with Hope, Inc., Michael co-founded Dreams in Motion. Dreams in Motion is a non-profit organization that provides athletic opportunities for children with mobility challenges or visual impairment. Michael is a board member and has been a spokesperson for the organization since its inception. He organizes events, coaches and helps raise funds. To date, Dreams in Motion has raised more than \$70,000 for specialized adaptive equipment and organized curling, soccer, dance, track and field, basketball and sled hockey events.

Michael has watched those around him learn new physical skills and improve their communication, sportsmanship and teamwork. All of these factors contribute to increased confidence for everyone involved with Dreams in Motion, especially Michael.

"My experience with Dreams in Motion has been great," said Michael. "I always want to be part of giving all kids opportunities to experience sports, but I still have a lot to learn."

To continue his education, Michael will study secondary social studies education and coaching at the University of Wisconsin (UW)-Whitewater. UW-Whitewater excels in these fields and offers an adaptive physical education certification program as well as top-quality athletics for mobility impaired students. Michael is confident UW-Whitewater will provide the education and experience he needs to become an inspirational teacher and coach. Michael said, "I believe this college experience will help me to be the best I can be at inspiring kids in my community to be the best they can be in the classroom, in the world of sports and in life."

"I plan on going to Northland Community and Technical College for farm business and management. I have been learning the ropes on our farm on how and what to do. I can already drive every vehicle on our farm. I drive both tractor and truck and I usually help out moving vehicles from field to field, along with hauling the grain and beans to the elevator. I also drove beet truck this year, doing the regular shift from the field to the piler. I also help out in our shop repairing the machinery. I have also walked fields with my dad looking at and comparing the different crop varieties. It has been very interesting to see the differences in each variety and seeing which one works the best for our farm. I have been along on comparing yields and seeing which variety we should plant more of in the future. I plan on having a small four-acre field of pinto beans and roughly 90 acres of beets. I will be doing all of the planning on my own from choosing my own seed and fertilizer recommendations to chemical application and timing. I will be the fourth generation on this farm and I look forward to working with and learning from my father and watching our farm grow and prosper."


