## Memorial Scholarship



Roger was born March 11, 1938, in Hartford, CT, son of the late Wesley H. Millard and Irmgard Burger Millard, and grew up in Pittsford, NY. He earned his degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery from the University of Buffalo School of Dentistry in 1962. While in dental school, Roger met the love of his life, Marilyn Runick, whom he married in 1963. Upon graduation he served four years in the United States Army Dental Corps, stationed in Oberammergau, Germany, and San Antonio, TX. After leaving the Army, he built his practice of 38 years in Baldwinsville, NY, and raised six children with his wife. The loving example they set is evident in the lives of their children and families today. He was a well-respected member of the community, active in local politics, the Baldwinsville school board and youth sports. When he retired, he was honored with a scholarship in his name. Dr. Millard has since passed, and the scholarship has now become a memorial scholarship.
