Chairman's Message

It has been my distinct pleasure to serve as Chairman of the Esperanza Scholarship Foundation Dollars for Scholars for over 20 years. This grassroots nonprofit organization has been serving the Inland Empire and Pomona Valley with a focus on providing students with financial aid in order to attend college. The Foundation has awarded over 1,200 scholarships to low-income, underserved, first-generation students that meet our rigorous criteria which includes a 3.5 GPA, 25 hours of Community Service, essay submittal, proof of financial need. All recipients must take 12-units or more each semester to maintain full-time status. During 2021 the Foundation established a Renewable Scholarship Program that provides funding through the recipients' Sophomore, Junior and Senior years that significantly reduces student debt upon graduation. Students: "Dreams only work if you do!"

President's Message

It has been an honor to serve as President of the Esperanza Scholarship Foundation Dollars for Scholars for over 10 years and an active Board Member for almost 20 years. There is a great need in the Inland Empire and Pomona Valley for scholarship organizations that provide students with financial aid to attend college. All of the Foundation's scholars are from low-income, underserved, first-generation students that have great potential for becoming the next generation of leaders in the community. Unfortunately, the Inland Empire lags far behind Los Angeles in per capita giving by Foundations. The Esperanza Board of Directors is looking for ways to close this gap by expanding its donor base through year-round fundraising, creative marketing and an increased social media presence. The Board expects to include details of these activities in a new 5-year Strategic Plan during 2022.

Outcomes and Analytics for 2013 and 2014 Scholars

Graduation Data About the Class of 2013

52% Graduated with Bachelor's Degree

The Foundation completed an extensive review of the 48 Scholars that graduated from High School in 2013 and determined the following results:

- **Scholarships Awarded = 48 (100%)**
- **Students Not Located = 12 (25%)**
- **Number of Bachelor's Degrees Received = 21 (44%)**
- **Number of Bachelor's with Master's Degrees = 4 (8%)**
- **Number still pursuing AA or Bachelor's = 5 (10%)**
- **Number of Bachelor's pursuing PhD = 1 (2%)**
- **Number that attended but no additional info available = 5 (10%)**
- **Grand Total Receiving Bachelor's Degrees = 26 (52%)**

The National graduation rate is about 60%. However, we were unable to access school records as privacy regulations make it impossible to locate some students including those that may have had name changes. If we look at the total graduation rate of the students we located, we get a **68% graduation rate** with the likelihood that others still attending college may graduate in the near future.

This group is diverse as are all years but heavily Hispanic; ethnicity breakdown is as follows:

- Hispanic/Latino: 39 (75%)
- Middle-Eastern: 1 (2%)
- White/Caucasian: 5 (10%)
- Asian: 6 (11%)

Graduation Data About the Class of 2014

52% Graduated with Bachelor's Degree

The Foundation completed an extensive review of the 65 Esperanza Scholars that graduated from High School in 2014 and determined the following results:

- **Number of Bachelor's Degrees Received = 34 (52%)**
- **Number of Bachelor's with Master's Degrees = 0 (0%)**
- **Number pursuing Master's Degrees=4 (6%)**
- **Number still pursuing AA or Bachelor's = 0 (0%)**
- **Number of pursuing PhD = 1 (1%)**
- **Number that attended but no additional info available = 8 (12%)**
- **Grand Total Receiving Bachelor's Degrees = 34 (52%)**

The National graduation rate is about 60%. However, the Foundation was unable to access school records as privacy regulations make it impossible to locate some students including those that may have had name changes. The primary research tool was LinkedIn but we were also able to locate some Scholars on Facebook and general Internet searches that led us to the College they attended. If we look at the total graduation rate of the students we located, we get an **81% graduation rate**.

This group is diverse as are all years but heavily Hispanic; ethnicity breakdown is as follows:

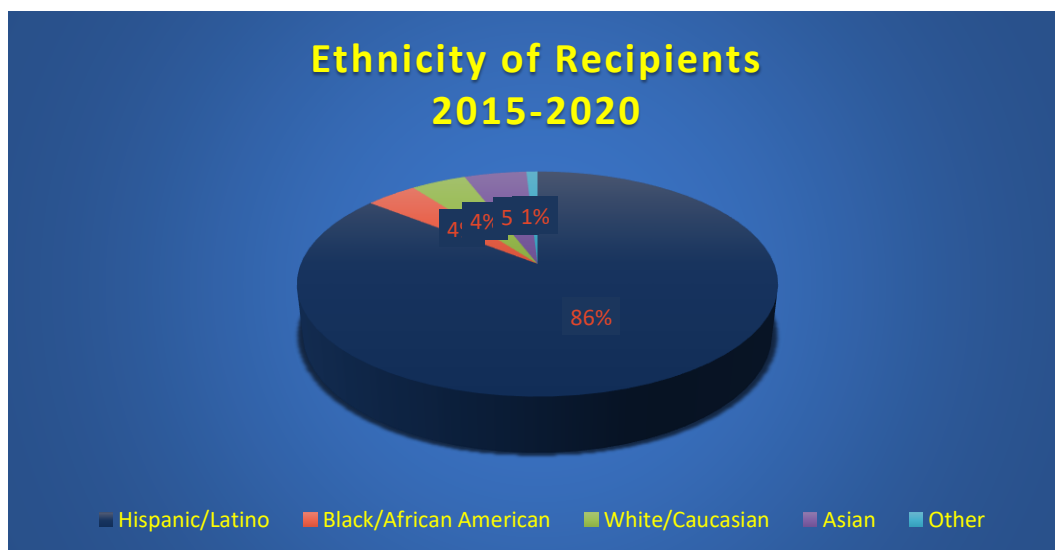

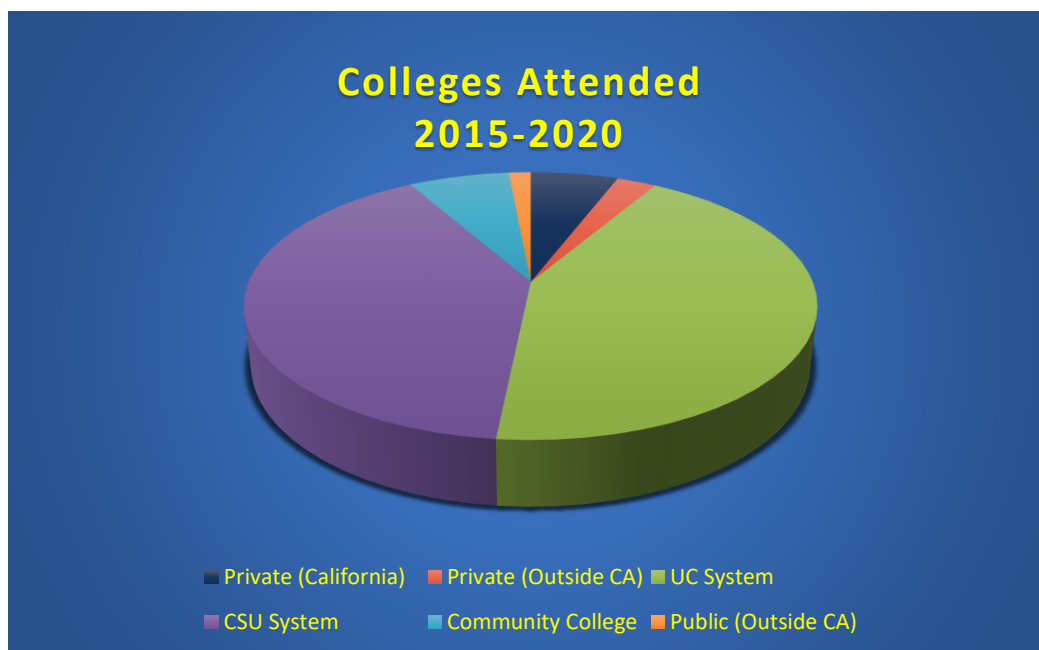
