Invest in the future of our community and our economy

September is an exciting month for us. I'm pleased to share that Bright Future has passed a significant milestone and to present an exciting new opportunity to you. This **September 2016** the number of student served by Bright Future program reached five hundred. To serve these students we expanded from one alternative high school, John Marshall, to 41 high schools. During the last 17 years we perfected our "Statement of Social Impact" and collected 68 quarters of students' performance. Our students consistently proved that when we offer them meaningful education, then they perform at a higher level and earn high school diplomas and community college industry certificates at significantly higher level. Our graduates are much sought after by hospitals, clinics, and businesses.

This summer our last four medical assistant graduates were hired immediately after completing their externship at an average pay of \$40,000 plus benefits **with zero educational debt**.

The geographic location of Seattle Vocational Institute and the limited number of Industry Certificate programs we offer to our students, has limited our growth. Lack of growth means a large group of students who could benefit from our programs are not able to access it. We want to change this. We are poised to deliver the benefits of the program to more employers, communities and students across our region.

And we need your help. Bright Future Dollars for Scholars and I are starting a fundraising campaign. We are planning to begin career/academic advising in at least one new local college in 2017 and we are counting on your contribution. The money we raise will help us cover the first year start-up costs of that expansion of the Bright Future program, after which the program will be self-sustaining.

News from Bright Future Dollars for Scholars by Mike Madden






