The following is in memory of a long time supporter of the Twin Cedars Dollars for Scholars, Jim Sevier. He attended and supported many fund raising events, including the Alumni Banquets. MANY Twin Cedars Alumni benefitted from Jim's teaching and encouragement to pursue post high school education.
