

Explanation of earning points towards Adopt-a-Class (AAC) Scholarships

	Earning Points Grades K-8	Earning Points Grades 9-12	# Points Required
Parents	<p>Parents may earn points for their children through events/activities planned for AAC events only..</p> <p>It's never too early to start earning points!</p>	<p>Parents can also earn hours in grades 9-12, but students must volunteer according to their own minimum requirements in order to qualify.</p>	<p>Any points that parents earn on their student's behalf are optional, and are above and beyond the student volunteering minimum.</p>
Students	<p>Students will not begin earning points until grade 9.</p>	<p>Students may earn points by volunteering at AAC-approved events.</p> <p>BHS students find out about upcoming events by listening to the daily morning announcements or from the daily bulletin sent to their email. Students must sign up for volunteer events in the BHS Counseling Office.</p> <p>Non-BHS students email Theresa Cavanaugh (cavanaugh@bpsk12.org) to be added to the notification list for upcoming events. You will be notified by email and have the option to accept a shift via email. You will also have access to the Daily Bulletin; see below.</p> <p>.</p> <p>BCSFDS website - https://bcsfds.dollarsforscholars.org/ --> Click on "Volunteers" --> Click on the link for current volunteer opportunities</p>	<p>In order to qualify for an AAC scholarship, high school students MUST volunteer a *minimum* of 2 hours per year (9th-12th grade) for a total of 8 hours.</p> <p>-In the event a student does not complete the required 2 hours of service during any given year, eligibility can be regained by completing a minimum of 16 hours of volunteering during their HS years.</p> <p>The noted minimum is just a minimum. Additional hours contribute toward higher scholarship awards!</p>
Tracking	<p>Parents must sign the parent sign-in sheet at each AAC-approved event/activity. These hours are turned in to the AAC Board via the Parent Coordinators.</p>	<p><u>Volunteer Events:</u> Students must sign in/out for AAC-approved activities and those forms are kept by the Board. Parents must sign a parent sign-in sheet at each AAC-approved event/activity. These hours are turned in to the AAC Board via the Parent Coordinators. >>Parent hours and student hours should be tracked on separate sheets. We ask that Parent Coordinators turn in 1 sheet for each event [additional time for meetings, etc. should be included on the Parent Sign-in Sheet].</p> <p><u>Dine-Out Events:</u> Receipts must be turned in to Theresa Cavanaugh / BHS Counseling Office within one week of the Dine Out Night. Non-BHS students must email the receipt to cavanaugh@bpsk12.org (or drop it off) within one week of the Dine Out Night.</p>	<p>*One dine-out receipt = .5 point</p> <p>*1 parent volunteer hour = 1 point</p> <p>1 student volunteer hour = 1.5 points</p> <p>*Effective with Class of 2028</p>
<p>Regardless of tracking done by the AAC Board, families should keep their own records, including dine-out events. Find a tracking method that will work for your family long-term. You only need to track parent hours, student hours and dine-out receipts. The AAC Board will convert them to points as shown above.</p>
