We all know this has been a year filled with unprecedented circumstances brought on by Covid19 that have changed the way we do life. Like many other organizations, groups, businesses, and schools, DFS has been affected by the changes.

Managing and selling concessions during fall and winter sporting events at WCA secondary school is the number one fundraiser for DFS. Because of the safety measures in place at the school, concessions are not allowed to be sold. Therefore, our funding is

down compared to past years, yet we still have several applicants applying for the scholarships.

This year we are relying heavily on the generosity of our current donors as well as new donors to continue to support our mission to provide financial scholarships to our students. We realize it's been a tough year, financially, for many. Due to our inability to fundraise through concessions, if you are a fan who normally attends games, we invite you to consider the following:

CONSIDER A GIVING LEVEL

WCA Dollars for Scholars established "GIVING LEVELS" in 2009 to recognize individuals and organizations who provide financial support for annual awards. In addition, the giving levels provide a means of budgeting for long-term goals related to giving.

Donors who commit to a specific giving level are recognized in DFS publications and issued reminders every year. Once requirements of a giving level have been met, donors have the option to join a higher level. Donors who continue contributions at the same level are considered "knighted" and recognized as such.
