

Dollars for Scholars Partnership: Community Educational Opportunities

Choose any three options to fulfill your local community's commitment to higher education awareness and be eligible for a \$1000 scholarship for your local Dollars for Scholars Chapter. The goal behind this is to encourage collaboration between local chapters and high schools regarding post-secondary education options.

College Application Month

College Application Month (CAM) is part of a national initiative known as the American College Application Campaign. The goal of CAM is to increase the number of first-generation and low-income students pursuing a college degree or other post secondary education. Events are coordinated by a site coordinator (usually a counselor or assistant principal) and may take place at the high school or online. If your community participates, consider volunteering if your site needs help! Even if your school doesn't need help with volunteers, you are able to count CAM as one of your options.

Career Discovery ND

Encourage your local students to register for Career Discovery presentations through Career Compass at careercompass.nd.gov. There is a wide variety of topics including how to research careers, financial aid and financial award programs, where to find and apply for scholarships, in-demand ND careers, how to find the best college fit/choose a major and what to expect the fist year on campus, among many other topics. Virtual presentations are live and recorded. These are great for parents to watch as well! As long as you are able to prove you shared Career Discovery information you are able to utilize this as one of your options.

Financial Aid Night/Day

Financial aid sources, scholarships and completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) are typically covered during these events. The goal is for students and parents to come away with a clear understanding of what the FAFSA is, what they will need to complete it and how to complete it. Check with your local high school counselor(s) to see if they complete one (or more!) of these events for their families. If they do, you can utilize this as one of your educational opportunities.

Financial Literacy

BND will create an interactive and engaging session specifically designed for your community to increaseawareness around financial well-being from the time a student is in high school until they are looking at retirement. Get the kids and community excited about saving, smart money moves and being financially fit. Until further notice, presentations will be virtual. If your school does a financial literacy presentationoutside of BND presenting you are able to utilize that as one of your options, it doesn't have to be from BND.

Scholarship Power Hour

Your local chapter will set up the date, time and place, possibly working with the school(s) within your community, to hold a 'Power Hour' where students will complete their Dollars for Scholars profiles and/or submit their Dollars for Scholars application(s). Schedule a live or virtual presentation about how to pay for college with BND's state-sponsored student loan program and learn about student loan refinancing when done with college and how it can help you.

Money Matters & Every Little Bit Helps – What's a College SAVE 529 Account?

Invite BND into your community (or virtually) to visit about saving for college. Did you know saving for college with a College SAVE 529 Account can start as early as the time a child receives their social security card? We will talk all about the benefits of saving for college – at ANY age – and the tax benefits that go along with a College SAVE 529 account. BND believes in the value of education awareness and preparedness from cradle to career this is where the cradle comes in! Attendees will also learn about BND'smatch program – College SAVE offers match programs for every newborn in North Dakota and an additional match that four of five North Dakota families are eligible to receive. This is a great event to gear toward elementary and middle school families to encourage them to start thinking about college funding.

FAFSA Videos

To help make applying for the FAFSA less complicated for families, share BND's FAFSA videos - you can share many ways: via your Dollars for Scholars website, social media pages, email, you name it! Videos cover what you need to complete the FAFSA, dependent vs. independent students, divorced and single families, determining assets, family size and FAFSA verification. These are in addition to videos on the overview of the financial aid process, Federal Direct and Direct PLUS loans, BND student loans, scholarships and grants, cosigning student loans and tackling credit cards.
