Burlington Scholarship Program

Applications for scholarships are posted on Naviance. You can access this list by clicking on the "colleges" tab, then clicking on the link "Scholarships and Money". You should then click on Scholarship List and change to view Local and Regional Scholarships. A limited amount of paper copies are also available in the Counseling Office. Burlington publicizes the scholarship program through multiple types of media. Notifications are sent to parents and students through Counseling blog posts, email and regular mail. Students always have the opportunity to meet with their counselor. Seniors will have several before and after-school opportunities to research scholarships in the College and Career Center with the scholarship advisor beginning in March.
