Lynn Schwandt Biography

Lynn Clark Schwandt was born December 23,1930 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where Lynn's father was working as a concrete superintendent.

Lynn started first grade at Minnesota City schools while his dad was working on a dam across the Mississippi River. When the Great Depression affected his father's employment, the family moved to Winona, Minnesota. His mother, a registered nurse, found work at the Winona Hospital. They then moved to Earlville, Iowa when Lynn was in the third grade. This was the final move for the family. Lynn graduated from Earlville High School in 1949 and wanted to go to college. He registered for the draft and moved to Cedar Rapids to live with his mother's sister and her husband. He found employment at a Nabisco warehouse. The prevailing wage at the time was \$.90 per hour with no overtime allowed.

Lynn applied to Coe College in the spring of 1950 but needed financial support. An angel by the name of Robert Armstrong appeared, solving that problem. Lynn received his degree in 1954, having majored in mathematics and physics and being certified to teach. Upon graduation, he had an offer to teach high school. He first checked with the Draft Board and entered the service in September 1954 where he served as a fire direction specialist with the 25th Division in Hawaii. He received an early release for seasonable occupation and started his teaching career at Stanwood, Iowa in the fall of 1956. During the two years at Stanwood, Russia put Sputnik into orbit and the National Science Foundation threw money at math and science education. Lynn applied for grants and rarely ever personally paid another tuition bill.

After two years at Stanwood, Lynn moved to Cedar Rapids, Iowa where he taught at College Community High School and Jefferson High School. While at Jefferson, he enrolled in an extension class from the University of Northern Iowa taught by George Immerzeel and Donald Wiederanders. That spring, Don and George knocked on his classroom door during an Advanced Geometry class. They invited him to apply for an open faculty position at the University of Northern Iowa Laboratory School. He accepted, and ultimately retired from teaching in the summer of 1992.

Lynn married Katherine Murphy while still in college. They lived in Hawaii where their daughter Susan was born. Three other children (Peter, Andrew, and David) completed the family. After 40 years of marriage, breast cancer unfortunately took Kathy's life on December 25. Lynn then found a new partner and married Joanne Spaide, whom he shared life and laughter with for 27 years until lung cancer sadly ended her life on December 10, 2022.

Education, community, and family have been and continue to be important pillars of Lynn's life. "My life was so changed by a tuition gift in 1950 that I still feel indebted to society today," said Lynn. "The Lynn and Joanne Schwandt Memorial Scholarship provides me with an opportunity to repay someone of that debt. My hope is that some recipients will respond in a like manner."
