IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS!!!!

Parents, please read the following instructions to help you choose a camp for your child:

Your child received an Academic Enrichment Scholarship that can be used at any of the listed programs and some others that are not listed. The total value of the scholarship is **\$250.00**. You **MAY** select more than one program as long as the total amount does not exceed the value of the scholarship. Special pricing may be available at participating camps for Jefferson Dollars for Scholars scholarship recipients only.

1. To complete your registration, you will need a **Camp Payment Authorization Letter**. This form is a double-signed authorization form that will be provided to you by your School Drive Coordinator or another school staff member. *You must have a copy of this signed form in order to receive the scholarship amount.*
2. Once you receive your Camp Payment Authorization Letter, you can choose one or more camps to register your child. While you are not limited to our Camp Directory, we strongly encourage you to use the attached list. **If you choose a camp not listed in our Directory, you MUST contact the office before enrolling your child.** When choosing a camp, please remember:
 - a. We do not fund sports camp, day camps, religious or Bible camps.
 - b. You must choose a camp that falls under the “enrichment” criteria (STEM, art, karate, dance, etc.)
3. You will need to give your Camp Payment Authorization Letter to the Director or another staff member of the camp you choose. This letter serves as our agreement to pay a maximum of \$250.00 of the camp costs.
 - a. If camp costs exceed the value of the scholarship, the parents are responsible for the remaining balance.
 - b. If you choose a camp and you did not use the entire award amount, you have the option to use the remaining funds at the same camp or you may choose a different camp.
 - c. If your child attends more than one camp, you will need multiple copies of the Camp Payment Authorization Letter. Please notify your School Drive

Coordinator of how many copies you will need so they can print the correct amount for you.

4. **IMPORTANT!!!!** Once your child completes their summer camp experience, you will need to complete a 2018 Summer Camp Report. Your child will receive a copy of this form at the annual awards ceremony, but they will also be available online on our website. Please print, complete and submit this form along with pictures or videos of your child engaging in camp activities. **This form is necessary so we can continue to receive funding for our program. Please make sure you submit a completed copy before the end of the summer.**

Padres, por favor, lea las siguientes instrucciones para ayudarlo a elegir un campamento para su hijo:

Su hijo recibió una Beca de Enriquecimiento Académico que se puede utilizar en cualquiera de los programas enumerados y algunos otros que no figuran en la lista. Description: Spend a summer at the South’s oldest, hands-on teaching facilities, where you will achieve new hands-on skills in glass, metal sculpture, animated filmmaking, welding, stained glass, kinetic sculpture, architectural engineering, sculptural bookmaking, and ceramics! All students design and execute their own projects under the assistance of faculty whom are all master-craftsmen in their respective fields. **Students are required to bring lunch each day or make arrangements. Also, to ensure hydration, all students must bring a water bottle, labeled with his or her respective name. No camp on July 4th.**

Three Week Session (ages 10 - 19) Jun 5 - Jun 23

Description: Students spend quality time on the hot shop floor learning the basic concepts of designing and executing projects in hot glass. Additional studios such as metal sculpture and welding, flame working, a Bookbinding Boot Camp, Screen

Printing, Block Printing, Animated Flip books, Engineered Pop Up books, and Architectural Float making, complement, copper enameling, and flame-working complement this ancient medium and students are encouraged to create multi-media projects.

One Week Session (ages 9 - 17)

Jun 26 - Aug 11

Description: Students can sign up for one, two, three, or more weeks and not necessarily back to back. The same studios are offered from the three-week session **with the exception** of glassblowing.

Session Descriptions

Venetian Glassblowing & Sculpture (Three-Week Session available only) - This workshop is designed to enable students to incorporate glass designs into other forms of media, whether print, metal, animation, or other, culminating in multimedia final projects.

Glass Torching (with Morretti glass) - Torchworking is the process by which colored glass rod (or "cane") is manipulated using heat from a single table-top torch, as seen frequently in chemistry labs. Students undergo a comprehensive introduction to creating exotic sea creatures learning, thereby, basic methods for manipulating small sculptures on steel rods (called "mandrels"), advancing brilliant and complex color patterns.

Stained Glass & Glass Mosaics - new students will learn basics of stained glass, including proper cutting, grinding, soldering, copper foiling and techniques. When equipped to prepare patterns using multicolored glass pieces, students will endeavor in creating a variety of unique, imagined designs, including brilliant stained glass window panels. Returning students will engage new challenges, including fabrication of increasingly complex, three-dimensional forms, as well as pattern-making in stained glass, along with glass mosaics, tabletops, sconces, lighted sculptures, and wall hangings.

Metal Sculpture & Welding - Young adults immerse into the art of metal engineering and creative design through welding. Such comprehends fabrication of armatures and sculpted structures using welding, cutting, bending, and the finishing of metal - utilizing principles of kinetics and motion. Students are encouraged to combine creations executed in glass and print into respective metal sculpture projects. As skill levels increase, students develop projects in the vein of wall hangings, outdoor metal sculpture, creative light fixtures, and glass/metal end tables.

Ceramic Sculpture - Using red earthenware clay, students will learn hand-building techniques to form whimsical sculptures. Contingent only on individual creativity and problem-solving, students conceive, execute, and fire their own works of art, which can be wall-mounted, or placed in a home, yard or garden.

Printmaking - includes bookmaking, screen printing, block printing, intaglio printing, animated flip-books, engineered pop-up books and Italian paper marbling. Traditional, flat-bed printing presses are used to generate one-of-a kind images on a diversity of paper, metal, and glass, while imparting knowledge of "relief" and "intaglio" printing methods. Additional image-making systems shall supplement traditional means, expanding educational scope. Students learn an array of techniques, including traditional bookmaking, woodblock carving, copper etching, letterpress printing, and Italian paper marbling - and how to incorporate each into their own individual projects.

Paper Engineering & Book Arts - Young adults combine printed images, along with creations from other studios, to execute three-dimensional communicative forms. The result is a one-of-a-kind, personalized hand-bound, pop-up book, encompassing printmaking and collage techniques. Faculty actively encourage students to follow personal creative visions; albeit, teachers, first impart requisite technical skills and vocational foundations in bookbinding, permitting construction of more advanced prototypes in paper making and engineering of pop-up books.

Paper Maché Sculpture - students learn basics for designing simple structures, and then how to build upon such knowledge by way of manipulating paper in pursuance of structural formations. Three-dimensional forms will emerge as students work towards sculpting life-size forms, to be completed by the end of each student's session and available for taking home.

Animated Filmmaking (Mixed Media) - Using smartphones, students synthesize tools, materials, and skill-sets acquired through printmaking to develop short animated films. Young adults will collaborate in effecting a narrative abstracted from sequential images, combining printed backgrounds with free-standing paper maché figures, props, and sets—culminating into an edited, animated film. Students take away technical skills and aesthetic concepts necessary for realizing a completed project, contemplating phases from story-boarding, to production, to post-production. What films our young adults create will be optimally formatted for sharing across devices, rendering mementos of summer adventures in filmmaking.

Kinetic Sculpture (Mixed Media) - Mobiles and kinetic art incorporate movement into the art of sculpture. Young adults will design and integrate printmaking into moving sculptures. Kinetic sculptures will be abstracted from template forms, and completed through a synergy balancing diverse media and technical skill-sets acquired through work with in areas of glass, print, and metal.
