



JAMESTOWN DOLLARS FOR SCHOLARS COLLECTS SOLES TO RAISE \$2,800

That's not a typo! More than 7,400 pair of new and gently used shoes gathered from Jamestown and surrounding communities raised \$2,800 for scholarships for Jamestown High School students.

Shoes were collected January – May 2019. They came in all sizes and types – athletic shoes, snow boots, dress shoes, tennis shoes, flip flops and cleats to start with. More than 30 schools, churches and businesses in the Jamestown area served as collection sites and during special events like the Blue Jay basketball game, Jamestown Area Childcare Services March Madness Shoe Drive, Jamestown Middle School Primetime Challenge and Jamestown High School's School Day of Service. Residents were involved in a big way, encouraging book club and Bible study members, co-workers, neighbors and friends to donate their shoes that hurt, didn't fit right or they weren't using. The Jamestown Volunteer Center gathered the shoes from the various collection points and RM Stoudt donated storage space.

Greetings and welcome to 2020! I want to say thank you to each of you for believing in our state's youth. Your support by shari ng talents, time and financial gifts means students can access scholarships for postsecondary education and decrease their student loan debt. It also reminds them that others believe in them and their future, a gift that goes beyond a financial dollar amount.

2019 was the first year that North Dakota Dollars for Scholars scholarships were available to all North Dakota residents, even if they did not have a chapter in their local community. This led to a record number of 3,683 submitted scholarship applications. We distributed \$96,500 to 88 students.

We express our gratitude to board members completing their terms this past year: Judy Harding from Divide County High School and Brian Schumacher from Alerus, and welcomed new board members, Katie Nettell from Lake Region State College and Alison Orgaard from Wyndmere and Lidgerwood High Schools. We celebrated our wonderful volunteers from across the state at the annual conference held in Bismarck in November with 31 chapters represented. Board members learned about volunteer recruitment/board governance, how to effectively market their chapter and how to develop a scholarship management roadmap; they also had several opportunities to network with other chapters.

Bank of North Dakota remains committed to providing administrative services for the North Dakota Dollars for Scholars chapter and creating statewide scholarship opportunities and supporting the local chapters to expand programs to support their own students. The Bank donated \$46,000 in scholarships to local chapters when they met a set of criteria that included completing three community educational opportunities within their community to help educate people about post-secondary education awareness. It's a model that has served the state well for two years!
