Roger and Arline dated through high school and were married in 1949. He was a sales representative, and she worked as a medical secretary. They had three children, all of whom attended Westfield Schools and went on to earn college degrees.

Roger served as a member of the Westfield School Committee for two terms in the 1960's. He was elected to the Westfield City Council in the early 1970's and served one term. Golf and skiing were Roger's favorite hobbies. Arline enjoyed gardening, sewing and crafts. In 1980, they moved to East Otis, MA and had a home on the Otis Reservoir. Roger continued his public service there and served as a selectman.

Roger Moltenbrey passed away in 1992 and never got a chance to see his grandchildren grow up. Arline loved being a grandmother until her death in 2004. Roger and Arline were blessed with six grandchildren, of whom they were very proud. One grandchild has earned a master's degree, three have earned bachelor's degrees, and the two youngest are heading for high school and college.
